



Remote Project Coordinator – Junior Rangers

This is a fixed term contract position living and working in the remote community of Ti Tree in Central Australia, 195kms north of Alice Springs. We are managing a national talent search and are offering generous relocation assistance and subsidised, furnished housing to the successful candidate as part of their package.

Central Desert Regional Council is a local government authority covering an area over 282,000 Sq. kilometres. The Council provides a range of services in 12 communities to the North of Alice Springs: Lajamanu, Ti Tree, Wilora, Nturiya, Pmara Jutunta, Willowra, Laramba, Nyirripi, Yuelamu, Atitjere, Engawala and Yuendumu, there are also several homelands and outstations.

Their vision is that Central Desert people have equality of access to services and opportunities that enhance their well-being and their mission is to protect and improve the wellbeing of their communities, by providing local government and other services, for people today and tomorrow, their strategy is Two Ways – One Outcome.

As the Project Coordinator, Junior Rangers, you will play a vital role in delivering the Ti Tree Junior Ranger Program, collaborating with the Project Officer to provide cultural and environmental education to school-aged children at Ti Tree School and within the broader community.

The primary objective of the program is to facilitate the intergenerational transfer of First Nations cultural knowledge and resource management practices. You will work in partnership with the Program Manager and the Steering Committee, comprising of Ranger Groups, Schools, Traditional Owners and Elders in developing a place-based curriculum that guides the program's delivery and evaluation.

The successful candidate will ensure that the program aligns with the needs of the community and supports both classroom-based and on-country learning experiences for First Nations students from the Anmatjere region.

You will have a Certificate IV or Diploma in Training and Assessment, or a related field, along with demonstrated experience working with young Aboriginal people from remote communities in schooling, youth work or training context and delivering culturally responsive curriculum resources that incorporate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander natural and cultural resource management knowledge.

In addition, you will have a proven track record supervising, leading and motivating your team to achieve project goals and program efficiency, along with the ability and experience to communicate proficiently within Aboriginal communities, diverse stakeholder groups and have a demonstrated knowledge and deep appreciation of First Nations culture.

If you are all of the above and have the passion, motivation and commitment to experience living and working in a remote community and display a high degree of professionalism, integrity and ethical behaviour then we would like to hear from you.

In return you will receive a competitive base salary and an excellent benefits package, including remote working allowances, 6 weeks annual leave, 15 public holidays, an additional 4 paid leave days, salary packaging options, flexible working arrangements, subsidised and furnished accommodation and relocation assistance, if applicable.

To be considered for this exciting opportunity you must meet the above criteria, have Australian Citizenship or Permanent Residency status and currently hold or be willing to obtain the relevant clearances, checks and requirements that are essential for this role.
